DO NOT:

- DO **NOT** DRINK THROUGH A STRAW for 4 days post-op.
- DO <u>NOT</u> FORCEFULLY RINSE YOUR MOUTH for 1 week post-op.
- DO <u>NOT</u> FORCEFULLY SPIT OUT for 1 week post-op. Forceful repetitive spitting can cause bleeding.
- DO <u>NOT</u> DRINK EXCESSIVELY HOT LIQUIDS for 1 week post-op
- DO <u>NOT</u> DRINK ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES! Alcohol will react with the prescribed pain medication and antibiotics.
- DO **NOT** SMOKE for 1 week post-op! Smoking creates a suction that will loosen blood clots, and cause bleeding, increased pain, and dry sockets.

POSTOPERATIVE FOLLOW-UP APPOINTMENT:

It is important to return to the office for your follow-up appointment. After a short exam you will be given additional post-operative instructions. By following these instructions, you will minimize the chance of postoperative healing problems.
